

HABEMA's ROSITA Program Empowers Yoparu Village Farmers and Strengthens Local Economy

part of their patrol duties, the Holomama Post, led by First Lieutenant Wanianto, launched the ROSITA program (Buy Up Farming Products) in Yoparu Village, Sugapa District, Intan Jaya Regency, Papua Tengah Province.

The initiative provided an opportunity for local residents to sell their agricultural products directly to HABEMA soldiers, bringing immediate financial relief and fostering stronger bonds between the military and the community.

Following the directive from Lieutenant Colonel Dian Dessiawan Setyadi, Commander of the 509 Task Forces, the soldiers went beyond their security responsibilities by actively supporting the livelihoods of local farmers.
